Domestic Violence Commissioner must give equal recognition and support to male victims of domestic abuse

Following the announcement by the Conservatives that if they form the next Government they will introduce a new Domestic Violence Commissioner as part of a proposed new Domestic Violence and Abuse Bill, **Mark Brooks, Chairman of the ManKind Initiative, a national charity supporting male victims of domestic abuse, said:**

“Whilst we welcome additional focus on domestic abuse which a Domestic Violence Commissioner would bring, it will only be a success if the Commissioner gives the same focus and recognition to male victims of domestic abuse as they rightly will female victims.

“Male victims far too often come second when it comes to recognition and services. If we are to truly live in an inclusive, fair and equal society, male victims should be equally recognised and receive the same level of support if they have the same level of need and risk as any other victim.”
